

What is Getting Ahead?

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is offering a free 16 week virtual program called Getting Ahead.

 Process Inc.
- Examine their own experience with poverty, as well as explore community issues that impact poverty such as housing, banking, jobs, and transportation.
- Assess their own resources as part of a move to greater selfsufficiency.
- Gain concepts, tools and relationships to make a difference not only in their lives but also in the community.
- Upon completion of the course, graduates are invited to attend a 6 month graduate- mentor program.
