Greetings Vincentians,

It is with mixed emotions that I share the news that Ann Schorno has announced that she will retire as our Executive Director effective May 30, 2025. While I am happy for Ann as she moves on to the next phase of her life, her leadership and tireless commitment to the Society will be missed.

Ann has led the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) in the Greater Houston area since 2010. During this time, the organization has grown from an \$8 million to a \$16 million agency. In addition to continuing to grow and stengthen the network of conferences and their 1,200 outneters, han has been instrumental in establishing the Archbishop Joseph A. Florenza Endowment Fund for the Benefit of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Archdicoses of Galveston-Houston (for Aid to the Pool which has raised close to \$10 million to date. She established the Underserved Communities Initiative to address dispariis across the Greater Houston area and our Getting Ahead Program with the focus on fostering financial stability, emotional well-being, and long-term self-sufficiency.

The Society of SVDP has been blessed to have Ann serve as the Executive Director these past 15 years. After spending 30 years in the private sector, Ann answered the call and has served as a true Vincentian with compassion and an innovative, forward-thinking approach that has produced tremendous growth for the Society over the years.

Ann has led SVDP through numerous disasters including Hurricane Harvey, Winter Storm Uri, and the COVID-19 pandemic. Through it all, the organization not only survived, but thrived. During the pandemic, SVDP almost doubled the amount of financial assistance provided to prevent homelessness and that same level of support has continued to this day. We cannot thank Ann enough for her service.

The Board of Directors has established a search committee that has begun the search for Ann's replacement. Ann will be evailable to assist with the transition of her replacement and will continue to be one of the 1700 volunteers actively living the mission of the SVDP atche praish upon reterment, and she looks forward to being able to spend more time with her paralls and family who all live in California.

Our friend in need, who came to the pantry for food assistance for his family of six, has faced numerous challenges over the past year. After losing his steady job with a heavy equipment company due to a serious back injury, he has struggled with limited job opportunities but Consequently, she lost their baby and required gall bladder surgery as well. Additionally, she suffered an eye injury due to airborne glass. This has caused her issues with lingering eye infections. managed to work in various contract jobs to support his family and make ends meet.

His wife who was five months pregnant was hit by a car while the family was crossing the street with their two youngest children. HIs wife managed to push her children toward the sidewalk in front of her to sustain the majority of the impact. Despite these hardships, including assisting with bedding for another family in need last year, he remains hopeful as he is set to start a full-time position as a paint contractor soon. He is grateful for the support from the **St. Thomas Moore Conference** for the support with the **Underserved Communities Grant**, which has been crucial in helping his family during these tough times.




Texans who have disaster related needs due to Hurricane Beryl may be eligible for disaster assistance under FEMA's Individuals and Households Program. Currently, residents living in **Brazoria, Chambers, Galveston, Harris, Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Orange, Polk, San Jacinto, Walker** and **Wharton** counties may be eligible for disaster assistance.

Deadlines to apply:

Derecho : 8/15/24 Hurricane Beryl: 9/10/2024 Eligible individuals and families in these counties can receive a one-time \$750 Serious Needs Assistance payment for essential items like food, water, and medication. Displacement Assistance is also available to help with temporary housing needs if you cannot return home due to the disaster. Additionally, eligible survivors may receive funds for rental assistance, basic home repairs, personal property losses, and other Hurricane Berylrelated expenses.
