Archdiocesan Council President Election Nomination Deadline


The deadline to submit nominations to our Council Office is April 15, 2025.

Names of persons nominated, who agree to serve if elected and meet the requirements of this position, and their autobiographical statement and a platform will then be submitted to all District Presidents before **May 1, 2025**.

District Presidents will share candidates' information within their District Conferences and ask each Conference to prayerfully discern their choice. Voting will take place via secret ballot at the **July 14**, **2025** Council Board meeting.

The person having the majority of the votes will be duly elected; Conferences will be notified by **July 18, 2025**.

Grant applications for your regions will open on March 20, 2025, and close on April 12, 2025.


- Download and read through the <u>fillable application form</u>.

- When your grant application is filled out, email it to <u>grants@svdpusa.org</u>.
- Your fellow Vincentians who serve on the national Grants Committee will read your application with empathy, then rank and fund as many grant requests as they can with the funds available at the time.
- You'll be notified of the grant decision by email by May 23, 2025.

Please Note: Unlike previous years, only SVdP Conferences are eligible to apply for the Friends of the Poor grant program.

Encounters with Immigration Agents



Keeping Data Safe

Learn what email encryption is, when to use encryption, and how to encrypt emails in Outlook / Microsoft 365.





Common Scam Types

Check cashing: Scammers approach people outside a bank branch and ask them to cash a check claiming they don't have an account or left their ID home. The bad check will be held against your account when it doesn't clear.

Romance scams: Financial support requested from a new partner that's exclusively online but it's an elaborate scheme.

Charity scams: You receive a request to donate to a fake SVdP; this is our official <u>website</u>: <u>www.svdphouston.org</u>.

Debt relief: Request for payment in order to establish a service relationship to pay, settle or get rid of debt.

IRS scams: Scam artists are pretending to be IRS officials to get money. They'll call, email, or text claiming you owe back taxes or there's a problem with your tax return. They even rig caller ID to make their call look official. They play on your fears. The real IRS sends official communication through mail.

Investment scams: A request to invest in a business opportunity with promises of high returns and/or getting rich quickly.

Lottery scams: Request to prepay fees or taxes in order to receive a large prize you supposedly won.

Grandparent scam: You receive a call or text message from someone claiming to be a grandchild or loved one asking for money to help with an emergency, plus instructions on where to send the funds. Set up family "passwords" to prevent this.

Puppy scam: Scammers post fake litters online or pretend to be someone they're not (usually an existing breeder) to take advantage of puppy sales (sans the puppies.)

Online Merchant/Marketplace Scams: When responding to ads or interacting in marketplaces on social media, research sellers and products independently to ensure legitimacy. Notice the red flags like a high-ticket item for a price too-good-to-be-true or a buyer who "accidentally" overpaid you for an item or someone asking for personal information or redirecting to an unfamiliar/strange looking URL.

Mortgage closing: You receive an email or text message that looks similar to your real estate agent's contact info that indicates there is a last minute change to the wiring instructions, and tells you to wire closing costs to a different account.

Suspect a neighbor in need has been a victim of a scam? Report the scam to the <u>BBB Scam Tracker</u> and the government via the <u>FTC ReportFraud site</u> and directly to the <u>FBI</u>.
